RULES AND REGULATIONS

1. Rules presented herein override those of any other society.
2. Guidelines for judging are those of the Canadian Rose Society. The colour classification is that published in 'The Canadian Rose Society Colour Classification of Garden Roses'. If the rose is not contained in 'The Canadian Rose Society Colour Classification of Garden Roses', the American Rose Society's 'Handbook For Selecting Roses' will be used. In case of dispute, the Show Chair's decision is final.
3. Exhibitors must register with the Show Secretary before submitting rose entries.
4. Exhibitors must register between 10:00am to 6:00pm on Friday. Exhibitors must submit rose entries between 10:00am and 6:30pm on Friday. Entries must be in place by 6:30pm on Friday. No late entries will be allowed.
5. The area must be cleaned and cleared of all exhibitors by 6:45pm on Friday, except for judges, clerks and show officials.
6. Roses must be placed in the correct class by the exhibitor or as directed by the exhibitor.
7. Roses must be correctly named and classified otherwise the rose will be disqualified, except in the case of Arrangement classes.
8. Classes are open to all growers in Alberta and Saskatchewan.
9. Roses must be grown outdoors by the exhibitor and planted prior to June 15th, except Arrangement classes.
10. Only one exhibitor may enter blooms of the same cultivar from the same garden in any one class.
11. Exhibitors may make as many entries as they desire in each class (exception in Rules 12 and 21) but only one entry of each cultivar.
12. Exhibitors are allowed one entry in each Arrangement class.
13. Roses must be displayed one rose to one container, unless otherwise stated. Containers will be supplied by the Society and must be used, otherwise the rose will be disqualified.
14. Hybrid Tea roses must be shown disbudded. Side buds will disqualify the exhibit. Recent disbudding will be penalized. This rule does not apply to Class 18 - Hybrid Tea Spray.
15. All foliage must be attached to the stem with the exception of 'Rose in a Bowl' (Classes 26, 87, 102, 103 and 104).

16. Roses must be exhibited with thorns on, but thorns may be removed for arrangements.
17. When a judge can determine with certainty that a foreign substance has been applied to the foliage, stem or bloom of a specimen during grooming in order to improve its appearance, that specimen must be disqualified. A foreign substance means such artificial grooming aids as: oil, green ink, paint, floral clay, pins, wires and cosmetics. A discrete wedge may be used in the neck of the container to stabilize the specimen.
18. In Arrangement classes, roses must predominate the display. Use of wire or other supports is allowed, but they must not show, otherwise points will be deducted. Purchased roses may only be used in themed arrangements (Classes 95 to 98). Accessories and other foliage are allowed unless stated otherwise. Dried materials are not allowed unless specified. Any container entered as a basket must have an attached handle.
19. Corsages and Boutonnieres must be displayed with a pin and placed on an unsealed, clear plastic bag. Roses must be home grown. Roses must predominate.
20. A NOVICE is a person who has not won five firsts in total in any Rose Show or Rose Section of any Horticultural Show.
21. In Junior (ages 6-10) and Youth (ages 11-16) classes, an exhibitor may enter more than one, but not more than three exhibits provided they are different varieties. Exhibits must have been grown by the Exhibitor but help in pruning and feeding the plants is allowed.
22. Potted roses must be in clean, unmarked containers or the entry will be disqualified.
23. Trophies will be awarded to first place winners only.
24. Exhibitors must be a member of the Calgary Rose Society or any visiting society to be eligible for Calgary Rose Show Trophies.
25. All trophies remain the property of the Calgary Rose Society. They shall be retained by the winner for one year and shall be returned clean and in good condition to the Show Secretary no later than the June members' meeting.
26. The Calgary Rose Society, its officers and committee members will not be held responsible for any loss or damage to person(s) or property. No exhibit or award shall be removed until the show has closed at 6:00pm Saturday. The Calgary Rose Society will remove class cards at 6:15pm. Unclaimed entries and awards will be discarded at 6:30pm.
27. All exhibits MUST be free of insects. All offending exhibits will be disqualified and removed from the show.
28. Hail damaged exhibits may be accepted without penalty at the discretion of the judges.

29. A judge must never judge a class in which there is a conflict of interest.
30. Once a class is judged, no changes to the ribbons or awards may be made.
31. Judging of classes must be completed by 10:00pm. Judging of trophies must be completed by 11:00pm.
32. Exhibitors in Section S are not allowed to vote in Section S.

GLOSSARY

Arrangement - a composition of colour, size and shape to produce a pleasing effect. Each unit is placed so that collectively they produce a design.

Basket - a container having a fixed handle. Unless other specified, a basket arrangement is to be viewed from all sides and is suitable for home use.

Bloom - one open flower usually on its own stem.

Boutonniere - a small lightweight 'buttonhole' flower (rose), suitable for a gentleman.

Bowl - a vessel for displaying flowers, having a diameter at its mouth equal to or greater than its height (see also Rose Bowl).

Colour - the normal colour of a cultivar at its best which should be clear, bright and fresh.

Condition - the overall appearance of the exhibit. This is an indication of the exhibitor's skill in growing and preparing an exhibit for show. Involves freshness and the absence of physical damage, insect damage or deficiency symptoms.

Corsage - a small lightweight arrangement of flowers and foliage suitable for a lady's evening wear - should be balanced and in pleasing proportions.

Foliage - the natural leaves of the plant, showing correct form and symmetry for the cultivar. Should be free of blemishes and on a straight strong stem.

Form - refers to shape and structure A good flower does not have even small deformities.

Fragrance - the natural and (usually) pleasant aroma of the cultivar.

Rose Bowl - includes vessels of generally spherical shape, with or without a stem, specifically designed for displaying a single floating rose bloom.

Spray - a group of blooms growing on a single stem. Should form a regular outline without gaps or unusual spaces. Should not be stem on stem.

Substance - refers to the ability of petals to return to their normal position if moved out of place. Involves thickness of petals, keeping quality and resistance to damage from handling. Outer rim of petal should not show any sign of wilt.

Vase - a vessel for displaying flowers having a height greater than the diameter of its mouth.
